GENOCIDE: THE HUMAN CANCER is an innovative confrontation of the powerful dialectics of life and death and how they are elaborated into the societal processes that determine the life and death of millions of people.

Charny defines the existential normality of the sources of man's destructiveness; and how evil is a natural potential at every level of human experience - individual, family and group. However, he argues forcefully that actual destructiveness is not inevitable, and that better understanding of the sources of destructiveness opens the door to effective strategies against violence and genocide.

He develops a psychology of nonviolent aggression for individuals, families and groups, and proposes a series of challenging ideas for reducing destructive violence, including a major proposal for a GENOCIDE EARLY WARNING SYSTEM which has been hailed as "a path breaking and critically important enterprise."

GENOCIDE: THE HUMAN CANCER was commissioned by the Institute for World Order in New York, and will be published by Westview Press in April, 1982.
