Conversation w/ Misho: his children cut school 1/2 week; total loss of control; must teach them at home; full of lit. plans, to translate <sup>Back to the sources</sup> Penguin Book, etc.

- domestic flights: attendants stay up front, do absolutely nothing, turn out the lights & leave the plane lit! radio blasting
- Arkady Monastirsky & sidekick pick me up; A. full of beans
- pick up in R. Goren's & Carlebach's very young wives; Goren very stingy
- seem to be flooded w/ visitors lately; hurt by disappearance of Fiddish
- tonight opening of Osher Shwartzman Library; various "ensembles"
- speak very broken Fiddish; obviously have no idea how to run a cultural institution
- no trad. of self-help, voluntarism, organizations
- Misho says this is typical of Ukraine, but I doubt it
- won't get to see Chernin who's leaving on the 80th
- impossible to get on any int. flight
- Chernin used to be ~~in~~ an ador-director; same repertoire as 70 yrs ago: first will 3!! , 200,000, "P-h" first N.Y.O.N.; Chernin turned Hitler into pro-Zionist play (here in Kiev!)

- Fishman's file of horrors: no one invited him; finally got turn to Chernin who found him a hotel room at 4 in the morning

- ~~is~~ very reminiscent of Israel except that here people work even less
- no security or fear of theft at ~~a~~ internal airport; people leave their bags unattended

- drooping electrical wires, huge pot holes, open construction sites  
no safety standards to speak of
- she is a retired doctor, quite educated w/wonderful sense of humor
- we visit SA's house on Kirovzarmyska but it's boarded up
- ubiquitous lines for very little food
- gold store is empty - all the goods bought up
- fur hats cannot be bought for love or ~~money~~

Boris Kinfeld - father from Zhankoy; mother refuses to learn alef-beys (3)

- the only ones with \$ to spend are the peasants, she claims, who have stopped producing ~~many~~ sausages that are easier to buy ready-made : - sausage shortage
- no fresh veggies or much fruit: Bella serves only pickled tomatoes, cucumbers, cabbage or preserves
- meet Bella's daughter-in-law Susan - Shushka is lovely granddaughter
- give her 1st pick of 1971 - presents which Susan correctly explains
- but no one knows how to play dominoes - not even Boris

- MC is Ukrainian woman w/ huge head of hair happy
- Jews very obsequious to Ukrainians; much talk about their coexistence
- Levitzo is the Old Guard Communist who glances & can only say 1 Yid. sentence
- Buchbinder reads from his poems & his side-kick doesn't even know which lang to speak in - obviously chooses Russian; older ones use to talk
- Shipiro presents from w/ 4 vols. of Kratkaya Encyclopedia
- 1 man reads his dussion poems by heart
- kind of town <sup>hall</sup> atmosphere of diff. people standing up to speak
- Beginning to see the generational fault: younger people either unself-conscious or defiant while older is too scared to really seize the day
- haven't yet seen a Esther Merkish type
- vast majority have never seen G.S.-DOUA lit before
- even presidium doesn't know that 8th candle = shanen; nervously wants to light from himself at very beginning; probably worried what the goyim might think
- older men sport their war decorations (even in shirt) while younger ones display Heb/Yid badges
- <sup>old rep.</sup> 7/26/73 perform 1/13, 1/20 9-10 & 1/21 & 1/22
- present nos 1/16 w/ roses & New Years card & ten go wild over the gift
- rep, for some reason, the flags (because it's so obviously a rel. symbol?)
- donate most of my books (that I haven't already given Misha) to library
- art work includes mod. sketches of Bergelson, Merkish, Feffer
- they, like us, feeding off clichés and the remains of 50 yrs. ago
- man who stands up w/ my menorah to make passionate speech
- children also declaim something Zionist at 11/1/73 that no one has ever done it!
- later hear Zionists fault the library for not displaying Israeli materials

## Meeting at Pedagogical Institute

- get there hr late because Kuperberg brings an English-speaking Jew terrified about not being able to get in apt. I make the mistake of giving him René's name
- Misho & Shloyme are waiting for us; Kuperberg unbelievably obsequious to the director; she, in turn, trying very hard to impress us.
- wants us to drink champagne; disappointed when we insist on tea
- runs a very tight ship; sharp Zdrastvuyte to a girl who didn't greet her 1st
- about to retire but looks 15 yrs. younger
- "Today everything is possible" - incl. Hebrew / Yiddish
- we visit Russian lit, Ukrainian folkways party; computer room; natural history & esp. the choir: at informal party sing us love lament but she insists that it's too sad; if reflects a gloomy past; so then they sing something lively; choir sings Black spiritual, pronouncing Jesus with a "Y" - favorite English-language writers are Jack London, Dreiser & Isaac Asimov
- the fantastic push for Ukrainian - create textbooks for all subjects
- not the mother tongue of many students
- (my God, what Yid could have had w/ Stalinist regime behind it!)
- director gives us 2 extremely expensive books
- we are emissaries from America who will perhaps provide the computers they need
- she reminds me of Gurdjieff - terrific rapport w/ teachers & students
- likes to believe that everything is run democratically, that educ. is vanguard of change
- but what impresses us is discipline, shining faces, nazaret, group effort, the terrific desire to please
- the whole meeting was set up for sake of Kuperberg's son, to get him exempted from our seminar; how his face shone when I mentioned his son to the director
- how reminiscent of SA's (6/16-1/21/57)
  - is n't it odd? neither Peysakh nor I could understand what our meeting had already effected
- Misho not nearly as impressed by her as we were
- for him, our pedagogy is far superior: dynamic, creative, imagination
- "each looks for what he's lacking": we for discipline, he for indiv. creativity
- here educ. is standardized (Shloyme's report due on Dec 31: length predetermined)
- if Kuperberg didn't need to submit 2 detailed plans, we would never have sat down to do it!

- Podol used to be thoroughly Jew, even after the war
- Shloyme has keen memories of the open-air market
- had 2 בָּנִים, 1910 who rehabilitated old פֿרַטָּה
- mother still lives in their original house, bought at end of NEP
- ∵ govt will not fix it: minuscule bathroom, you need a wheelchair to sit there
- original plumbing, floor, furnishings gathered after the war
- his extended family lived above (like Zelmayzner!)
- the uncle who spent 4 glorious months in NY, returned home to be drafted as a deserter; spent war in Caucasus; everyone had false papers
- Shloyme has wonderfully ironic sense about life: how they ~~appeared~~ proved over collectives in 50's-60's only to destroy the new government again for local color
- stories about recent Congress in Moscow: protected by Ukrainian nationalists w/blue-yellow emblems (from Lvov)
- plied w/ the Jews not to leave the Ukraine - ↗ יונק ז'ר 10 000\$ 12
- Pruzhet's placards; next day faced off against Palestinians
- Shloyme remembers the proto-dissidents of the 60s
- realizes that this brotherhood can last only so long as mutual hatred of Russians
- Fortunately, Ukraine will never be allowed to secede.
- profound understanding of what culture Soviet Jews lack
- highbrow non-apologetic material or per w/ what they knew of Russian culture
- how local TV station interviewed him in the 1990 w/ "kosher" chicken!
- 1st times & moments when we extent of Jew-self-knowledge
- I tell them abt my meeting at André Schiffriis': same but diff
- we at least have ample outlets for scholarship
- Shloyme an ardent opst, spends 4 months evryr. in Central Asia, earns abt 150 rubles/month, less than Mishka
- unusual BT - Lubwitzer took notice at him while he is critical of the Kfar-shul-yidn; יונק ז'ר פֿרַטָּה גְּדוֹלָה יְמִינָה

- Boris writes eloquent over artists festival in early spring when chestnuts bloom
- everyone points out Bulgakov's house where White Guard takes place
- ancient foundations of original church, citadel, city
- NCART miss miss posters on reserved poles
- the St. Simeon's was supposed to have Chmelnitsky statue on it but censor nixed it; then again, Chmel's statue was supposed to stand on a few steps but the sculptor ran out of \$!
- begin replicas throughout the city
- visit SA's plaque - Arkady knows every house he lived in
- which gymnasium did Akhmatova attend & which Chernivtsi?
- St. Sophia's distinctive architecture; Yaroslav the Wise: distinctiveness of Ukraine from Muscovite North; Kievan trade route had been run by Jew. traders, but was there really a Cossackite?

## Dream Book

- most intense dream I have ever had in my life
- New Years Night about cross/threats: centers on Borukh: when I hear a young academic threatening him I burst out crying; another a medical discussion between him & Anne; went for a certain juice test to another hospital because the one we're in refused to administer it; nurse is reading Swedish transl. of? ~~The Green Agarivium?~~
- most dreams happen at Pagnols: the people living at the Feiffers have a beautiful crippled daughter; parade at the Ferron's driveway; I'm explaining my dreams to someone while Shira goes off jogging somewhere; see 2 nude women go off to her room; when I follow her there it turns out there's already 2 men in her bed. He comes to taunt me w/ leather jacket later but I swear to Shira that "nothing transpired between me & that woman." I have just returned home from Russia to Argel & his kid brother.
- the new metro opening triggered an association w/ Seminary: bulldozers clearing a path so whole faculty has to "evacuate"; Ismer is right behind me
- night before last I dreamt not seeking solace from Eva but her bed was empty. Found her lying between parents, the father was on mother's side of the bed; when she pulled off her nightgown, she had a small penis.
- another dream abt having my wallet stolen; Michel Alpert fishes it out of a barrel in full view of everyone, then returns \$1500 wet bills.

Thurs

- Incredible dream about father perhaps prompted by episode in class when 1 elderly man wanted to recall his mother if he had the power of ~~"say yes/no"~~
- we're walking together (in Pagnols?) & he's confiding a story about his best friend Helle who taught him to be in touch w/ feelings, to open up: I am astonished to hear my father talking this way. We come to the Minyan (archetype!) & the conversation continues in public, only now someone else (Judy Pepper?) will demonstrate how Helle taught my father "how to touch the water." She is clumsy. Has to stand on 1 foot & turn around & can't quite do it, but everyone is very interested.
  - then we begin reading a Warsaw Ghetto chronicle - somehow connected to him.
  - the person reading can only read the Polish but not the Yiddish: her women had to wear ugly distinguishing headaddresses & people slept in 12-yr shifts. The morning (or evening) shifts had to be roused & kicked out of bed, forced to evacuate each time.
  - I thought: how could one film these women - no Hollywood producer would do it - but maybe by the uprising they fought w/ free-flowing hair
  - inspired by this reading in Polish, some Minyan members - led by Kirk Broder - get up to sing the Hebrew liturgy in Polish. I laugh nervously. So other minyan members - not former Hebrew-niks also stand up in solidarity - and I think in silent protest to my laughter. Dad then gets up to leave & I follow him out
  - but we sit down on a hill instead, overlooking the minyan. So 2 new members come running after me thinking I left in protest. I decide to go back for ~~shofar~~  
but wake up before I can.

### Russian Manners

- speech differentiation analogous to Britain's only Mishz claims that Moscow speech is liability in govt circles - all bureaucrats come from the provinces & distrust Moscow - leningrad speech
- educated standard created by Moscow Art Theater
- everyone is a master sociologist of lang.
- Shlyyne claims you can recognize a Jew's speech by his diction & correctness
- Brezhnev made countless mistakes & many jokes circulated about them
- even Gorbachev mis-accents certain words & govt officials imitate his mistakes
- diff. dialects of Ukrainian, too, of course

### Jewish Politics

- Mishz can understand the Yevsektsia: give these Jews absolute power & they'd kill their competitors
- incredible proliferation of groups & splinters
- PIONER <sup>118</sup> is run by a totalitization → now about to split into 6/7 parts
- Kottyzsley started his own called Lurie
- zided & absented from abroad because Israelis/Americans want to feel imp while local officials are getting rich & hope it will help them in their bid to immigrate
- Poyntch says he can now understand SA's ("") <sup>1938</sup> : when you're powerless, you talk and talk and talk
- but Ukrainian journalism is much more flowery than Russian
- if there's nothing to say, you might as well liven it up!
- Arkadyev repeat in Birobidzhiner Sktern bears take out
- Vergelis was always an enemy of Biro. ; now they're readying an indictment against him ; once escaped thru a window when his brother came to visit
- hilarious anecdotes about similarity in phone numbers
- imagine imagine their surprise when Mishz answers - in fiddish - that they have the wrong number! Answers guess about the holidays
- SH kind of bar club where Jews come to shoot the breeze, find out about Israel consulate & discuss immigration
- Mishz defends Vergelis's literary sensibility: SH only source for Jew. art
- Bank in Uta paid 800 rubles to rent hall where Congress took place (<sup>Mufti owns the bank</sup>)
- everyone in <sup>Tashkent</sup> Uzbek region desperate to leave: Russians & Jews alike
- new hysteria now to get into Hebrew classes
- old man goes beyond <sup>now</sup> 9/10
- you can earn handsome income teaching Hebrew : 5 intes / 3 hrs.
- even the NKVD Hebrew specialists coming into their own!
- breakaway 'syg' in Kiev to fight Levitas - Levita was shot dead off stage in Moscow

Trip to Boyarka New Years Day 1990

- 1/2 hr train ride which we could never have negotiated on our own
- trains are no frills, no smoking, probably no bathrooms either
- finding a bathroom almost as hard as finding a restaurant
- yesterday in the Bazaar, today at the train station;
- now you have to pay for it, too, from 10-15 kopeks.
- the Boyarka dachas on rich side of town (Karl Marx St) are quaint enough otherwise there's only the steam engine of the legendary train, 1st to be built after Rev.
- Lenin is ubiquitous; his statue towers over train station, too

Boris brings Pyszchik's incredibly heavy box

- feels as if he were an Israeli living in USSR: knows that the colors here are grey & brown but that Byelostok represents the rainbow
- vivid recollection of foreign delegations visiting Pioneer Camp - how the children all jumped at the type recorder that was discarded
- analogy to the dreidelkhl I brought that are all the rage of Kiev
- but pleads w/us to distribute what we have ~~will~~ among the Seminarians
- when he wanted to buy a single rose instead of a whole bouquet, accused of being an American
- summers spent in far north near Vilkuta kayaking w/wife & daughter
- his 2 dictionaries: Yiddish-Russian pieced together & bound from SH supplement; Russian-Yiddish from Moscow 1941!
- his article in no. 2 11/8-1990 about creating a Kiev Yiddish Theater w/out teachers
- impossibility of reading classical writers even w/old-timers because of their ~~already~~ ignorance of Hebrew & traditions.
- joke: how it took 17 yrs to move from 1 end of Kreshchytik → other (new Lenin Monument vs. Old)
- Yaroslavsky, one of my addressees: he'll know about impending pogrom 2 days before it happens  
(Mishz tells us that ~~most~~ many Ukrainian writers grew up in shtetlekh & speak fluent Yiddish; some even went to Yid. schools, since there weren't any others!)

Mishz laments the demise of Museums of Atheism - all the Jew. objects are being discarded & dispersed

- 1st few minutes very awkward: they stood up before answering, Josef Torchinsky had penned a greeting on the blackboard which he declaimed, they were much older than we expected. I tried to break the ice by asking abt the portraits on the wall
- more than 1/2 received formal Yiddish educ. until 1939, some of the Kievites were Torchinsky's students - he insists on Soviet spelling, but I told them abt Yid-Yid
- terrified of Hebrewisms - the Yeshivash did its job well
- never heard of M.L. Alpern, Marger or Sutzkever

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- Bornick's fine literary sensibility

- 1) why he'd not choose to be a Yid-Yid - because they got burned at the stake while whoever has it has mark too (Yosl countered that someone has to be a visionary!)
- 2) why he felled the tree - because he happened to be in a forest & had to try out his newly-found powers

Funny discussion about Yid-Yid: younger ones wanted their independence, older women wanted that parents know best

- if Yosl had unlimited powers, would wish that Jews cease behaving like goyim, while another one would resurrect his dead mother
- with all the resources of the Soviet state, what a crippled culture they created!
- each one writing up list of addresses & personal data

- phone call 8:30 am from someone speaking Hebrew. Wants me to punctuate his book of medical terminology
- Shmuel Kotler; much too full of himself; also talks too much
- his mini-computer to keep track of everything
- how he brought home 2 vulgar antis-J. jokes when he was 4 yrs old
- about a statue of the king made of chocolate

Shaul Kotlarsky et al.

- learned from that not to bring home any jokes - established to learn that he was Jew.
- 6-Day War - orgy of anti-S at school pushed him over the edge
- tells identical story as Boruch about asking his grandmother - p.11 4/6/ND 02/05 'W  
18/05/1986? McCorb?
- She began to teach him (or he taught himself) from 1961 issue of SH w/ 1st (cases)
- first word he could piece together was JEW
- brings about his efforts to acquire Communist Jew. press: Poland, Russia, Birzblidzher  
(failed thru her Institute of History but then the rest of the Moheims in Moscow  
prayed for a subscription to Folkshtime himself)
- Shows us a Tiddish primer from Poland from 1958  
(theme of very old books that somehow were salvaged from the wrecks)
- I can see why Kratikov is so critical of him
- Jurij Lotman ~~is~~ is Jewish; his wife reads lectures about anti-S in works of 19th cent  
Russian lit, but all their grandchildren are pure Estonians
- Lotman himself is a citizen of St Petersburg
- tells us not to trust new library - State institution that won't serve Jews

Painful discussion abt burial practices - Elena wants to know if Jews who are  
cremated will also be resurrected - no Jew. burial ground

- every 50 yrs. cemeteries are used to make room for the new
- have the option of relocating the tombstone
- that is what the Workers of Odessa did w/ Mendeleo in 1927
- Balzare very impatient w/ whole discussion  
(hatred of private enterprise - even among Jews)
- invented bizarre dialogue -  
? הנץ של עוזר לוי (the ~~last~~ of Shlomo) is 1/6: 11/11/13 5802 sic 'v  
- Tanker explains that it's too late for them - they're all atheist
- but Yitskhok, the only one wearing a סיגל, is intermarried!  
(later will give him a pair of פ.פ.ז.א.)
- later joined by not-so-young woman from Czernowitz: "Why didn't your parents  
take me along?"
- Ina, the only attractive woman in the class, cannot read, speak or understand!
- Blaya Leyzl spoke no Yiddish from 1951 when she left home for the Institute,  
and 1988, when she signed up for a Tiddish class. Her mother saw no point in  
teaching her to read or write
- Moysha grew up in a hof in Zhitenis, almost exclusively Jew. His English is  
bookish but fluent - learned to read 4 days ago!

- only 3 women teachers (who also made eye contact) dared to ask questions
- nodded in agreement when I told about corrupting influence of Affirmative Action
- upside down version of their "5th line"
- most earnest among them said that their discrimination works along ethnic/class lines instead ; peasants are down-graded ; she wanted to know if I ever had to hide my identity
- they are also in the throes of curriculum revision - 1st breach in Bismarckian system
- gradual intro. of electives & minority studies
- 1st gymnasium to open in Moscow, New-humanistic curriculum (this had brought laughs from Natasha in Beginner's Class)
- Jew bleach-blond from Vilna wanted to know abt higher ed. in Israel
- fascinated by Hirsch's Cultural Literacy - recalled science component (promised to send them a copy)
- utterly amazed when I talked about women's studies - incredulous abt lesbian/homosexual caucuses at MCA
- one gorgeous woman challenged me : why were you so amazed to discover the poverty of Soviet Jewish/Jew. culture?
- ~~Was it she who noted abt illiteracy in America?~~

folklore

- As we pass Bulgarian embassy, George recalls that Krasarov was quoted in Soviet press as saying that USSR could solve its economic woes by selling Bulgaria to the Chinese
- this prompted outrage on part of the Bulgarians

George: my new lang teaching methods in America

A: Americans notorious abt learning langs; collapse of lang requirement just 69  
also cannot write an essay anymore

Tevye-Telsel ~~performance~~ - 3½ hrs long

- 2 VIPs in front row seats; young couple bumped to the side
- we had 2nd-row seats
- excellent stage design of roof-table - > 211
- shatell = room of the stars; Leyserch said candle device goes back to Mikhaels (cf. end of Bruno Schulz movie)
- superb performance of Menakhem-Mendel - totally plastic body; perfect fit for his garish clothes
- Tevye beardless, sometimes hatters, no /G-116 later does a Yarmulke (Bach says he himself is an anti-S!)
- always he pulling the cart (apparently his wife died before the play begins)
- only explanatory note is the Rabbi (borrowed from Fiddler)
- puts on a shtetl to make kiddush
- 3 dance sequences (at least 1 too many) - men & women dance together
- daughters strangely effective despite their strong Slavic features
- 'ey GFG is as real in Ukrainian as in Yiddish
- funny use of Yiddish, as when Stepn, an invented '12-13P, tries to exorcise God's illness; or drinking bout between Leyzer-Volf & Tevye
- that scene played for laughs - at least 20 minutes long, w/ MM as 103% behind the scenes.
- Ukrainian Urodnits & Stepn both sympathetic characters
- only outside E. Orthodox visitor or deuces from St. Petersburg
- extremely responsive audience: clap during dance sequences
- at least here the emigration theme is dealt w/hard-in, except that only first cart Leyzer Volf goes off to America; the rest for Berdichev but MM comes to them instead in comedy of errors.
- Chava returns with Fedor & everyone is reconciled
- shouts "I don't want your Sabbath!" as if she left for religious reasons
- very effective use of torn ~~101A~~ - symbol of sacrifice w/ Tevye holds up to God
- MM announces to Tevye that he saw Perchik in Kiev carrying a red flag  
Only the corpulent butcher Leyzer-Volf goes off to America, awkwardly uttering his 1st English words: "<sup>use</sup>Goodbye."
- Ukrainian types speak a coarser accent than the Yiddish-speaking ones
- before leaving sit down for a Doina Yac - do you do this too, asks the Ukrainian
- the elderly couple who give us a lift also, want a favor - bring <sup>out</sup> dolls for their daughters in Seattle

## Leave-Taking

- in childlike way, students write poems & present us w/certificates
- chip in a lot of \$ to buy us rugs, red presentation covers, cakes
- I try to set the mood w/ *EV Jólik* & another solo performance of *BYLBYA NT*
- but Igor is there w/his speeches & hype; even sour-faced Levitan joins the party (earlier there was a shooting match between him & Riva from Odessa; Igor is conciliatory; admits their mistakes & inadequate planning)
- announce month-long seminar this summer; elementary school in 1991
- tremendous sense of gratitude to us → exaggerated expectations
- Yankov thinks he'll be running the seminar! ("Why didn't he get a picture...?")
- Poyatzhi's idea of giving out the pictures as gifts goes over exceptionally well
- I explain & reiterate that there simply aren't enough to go around
- Mark visibly hurt that he wasn't honored but I felt that he was untouchable
- Natasha, Eugeny surprised to be singled out; fiery Elena relieved (saved her for last)
- Miriam *SJAK BN BG BZ V CJ COV*
- despite their harsh living conditions (open toilets 5-in-a row!), formed friendships; have few places for Jews to congregate, socialize
- Nuna wants me to write dedications on copy of *Austsky*
- last hr. on Svitlana goes over well: know next-to-nothing abt Jew. partisans esp. moved by *P'L KJV L* ? *PO! ZYSS'Z ZE*
- only Yankov appreciates humor of *Mafis* *SDS'P - PNIA*
- copied our addresses as if they were a magic formula, a talisman
- Boruch brings me BB medallion & pins; I give him Ukrainian flag instead
- how much it actually costs to leave - roughly 5000 rubles per family
- he will have to cough up \$10,000; must renovate your state-owned apt before you leave
- Tues**
  - lengthy discussion of NT - why they say we murdered Jesus
  - moved by my explanation of *BBJR* → Crusades → Hitlerberg
- Wed**
  - Boruch: pay scale for a teacher: 130 rubles/month starting salary for 18 hrs/week (pay you less computing your wages monthly) + 30 for teaching Eng, Russian, Math (you grade student papers) + 30 for being section head
  - ∴ undriven by low wages & status of teachers in Israel
  - who told me the story about Shevchenko saving Jew. horses in a fire?
  - Nuna who's researching trans. into Yid (Hofstein, Feffer)
  - I am "found out" in the hostel as an American (What are you doing here?) then stalked by a dim-witted Ukrainian
  - Negev asks Boruch who's side he's on - hedges his reply
  - at 4:30 am, Yasha appears in hrs. early - tells us of his radiation sickness

## Jewish Communists

Incident at airport: refuse to pay \$1250 overweight (instead of \$20.50!) so they let me go without paying anything; but had to relinquish the caviar

- same thing happened on the way in when my visa wasn't stamped for Kiev
