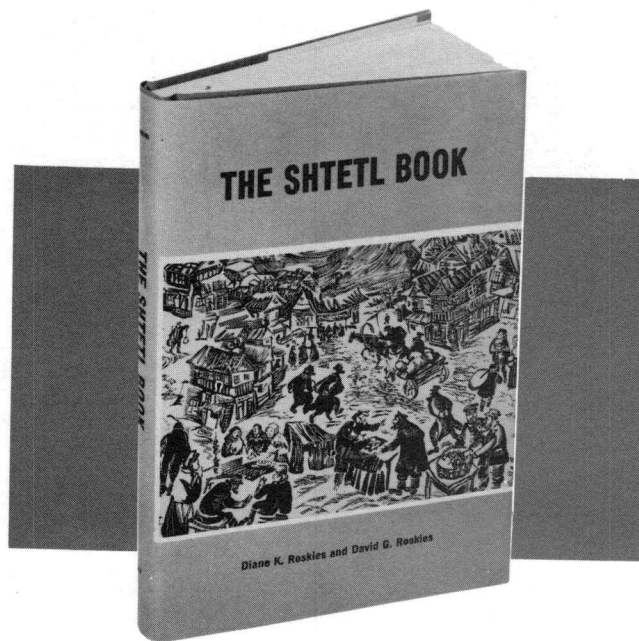

THE SHTETL BOOK

In the vast area known as Eastern Europe there is a country called Poland with a province known as Lublin where there once was a Jewish market town called Tishevits. This is a source book on Tishevits — a model shtetl — and on the life and lore of East European Jewry.

Unlike previous attempts to present a romantic overview of shtetl life, **The Shtetl Book** brings together actual historical, literary and ethnographic sources written by the culture bearers themselves. These include: memoirs, documents, short stories, folktales, proverbs, folksongs with music, and maps. Almost all of this material has been translated for the first time.

The text is arranged in a lively and entertaining manner according to themes: shtetl geography, the Yiddish language, relations between Jews and non-Jews, work, growing up in the shtetl, religious and communal life, entertainment, attitudes to death, political and social change. A full-size map of Jewish Eastern Europe and over fifty photographs are included.

The Shtetl Book can be used as a course book in Jewish History, American Jewry, and as an essential background to the study of the Holocaust.

A detailed **Reader's Guide** accompanies **The Shtetl Book**. It provides valuable background material on each selection of the book and suggests ways of organizing the material for individual and classroom projects: how to use the information in **The Shtetl Book** to interview grandparents and informants from Eastern Europe; how to use the maps and charts to trace family background and immigration to America; how to supplement the text with encyclopedias and fictional works.
