Row over Holocaust play sees Goody resign post

TORONTO -

Max Goody has resigned as chairman of the Congress Central Region Holocaust committee after the CJC officers decided to cancel a play he had arranged to be presented at Adath Israel.
"What kind of democratic

"What kind of democratic structure is this if the officers can overrule the executive," Goody exclaimed when interviewed by The Candian Jewish News last week.

The regional executive voted April 11 to support the officers' decision to cancel the controversial play, despite its earlier decision to co-sponsor it along with Adath Israel.

Milton Harris, Central Region chairman, charged that

Goody's idea of democracy "is that a chairman of a committee can do anything he wants to."

Continued Harris: "I take full responsibility for the

officers' decision. I sold the officers on this. Goody had no support from his committee."

Ironically, it was Harris who appointed Goody to the position. "I wanted to make the Holocaust observance a more important event to the Jewish community and to seek a broader appeal for the program," Harris told The CJN.

As chairman, Goody said he wanted to establish a Holocaust museum in Toronto, to compile a book from the personal experiences of the survivors and to write a Haggadah of the Holocaust. He also wanted to hold a number of Holocaust services in Toronto and modify the annual community-wide ser-

vice to convey some message to the young generation.

"The vast majority of Jews in Toronto get no Holocaust exposure at all," he said, pointing out of 100,000 turn out at the annual event.

only 2,000 of a community ed the idea. "I didn't lobby for it...because nothing as critical and holy as Holocaust should be decided upon on the basis of pressure tactics."

Goody then contacted Rabbi Erwin Schild about the play, Night Winds, by David Roskies, and his congregation, Adath Israel, agreed to put it on with the co-sponsorship of Congress. The regional executive gave its approv-

Harris explained "we were not aware of the nature of the play. After the decision to co-sponsor the event, a number of Holocaust committee members came to me to complain of the presentation."

They were critical of it because they found it uncomplimentary to survivors, said Harris. The thrust of the presentation was the Jews went to the crematoria like sheep and that the reason it happened was because God punished Jews for past transgressions.

"A chairman of the committee is not a dictator. He has to make decisions with his committee," declared Harris. "Max had no support from his committee, he did it on

his own and deeple hurt the feelings of those on the committee. My own opinion is that it's insensitive. (Harris said he had read some of the passages).'

After Harris phoned Goody to notify him of the officers' decision to cancel the play, Goody had the matter placed on the agenda of the April 11 meeting. A motion to support the officers was moved and passed.

However, Goody has asked for a ruling of the constitutional authority of officers to overrule an executive decision. Said Goody: "If the officers have that power to overrule the regional executive, then it is nothing more than a rubber stamp body which in real fact has no power at all. The element of the democratic authority and rights of the executive is reduced to shambles. If this is the case, it might be wise for all supporters of the merger (Congress, Welfare Fund) to ask some questions before it is too late."
