Dear David:

I am delighted to appoint you Visiting Professor at the Jewish Theological Seminary for Project Judaica in Moscow for the period February 15 - May 15, 1993. As you know, Project Judaica is a joint academic venture between JTS, YIVO and the Russian State Humanities University.

You will teach two courses on "Survey of Modern Yiddish Literature", each of which will meet four academic hours per week. Your responsibilities will include consultation with students, preparation and grading of assignments and an exam for each course, and availability to give guest lectures or seminars to other classes at the university.

The Jewish Theological Seminary will offer you an honorarium of \$25,186.50 and Russian State University will pay you a weekly stipend in rubles. The project will reimburse you for the cost of your round-trip airfare to Moscow, as well as the travel of your wife, Shayna, and son, Arye Leyb, and will provide you with appropriate housing. In addition, the project will cover the cost of medical evacuation insurance, medical insurance (should the purchase of the latter be necessary), and daily kosher dinners. In the unlikely eventuality that political conditions make it impossible for the program to proceed, the project will pay you your honorarium in full.

In order to arrange for your visa, please submit the following information to Ms. Rebecca Jacobs, the project's coordinator, as soon as possible: your name (as it appears on your passport), year and place of birth, citizenship and passport number, and your home address. This information is also needed for the family members who will be accompanying you.

I am very pleased that you will be participating in this exciting academic program.
