Dear Dr. Cohen,

Nili Gold has informed me that she is applying to the Seminary for work, and though I am not aware of any openings either in the department of Hebrew language or in ours, I hasten to recommend her to you.

Mrs. Gold is the best student I have had occasion to teach in the past three years. She took two courses with me in 1975/6, undeterred by the difficult English readings. Unlike most Israelis (if you will permit me to say so), she was receptive to new critical methods and I can still vividly recall her classroom presentation on the most sohpisticated writer we studied that semester, David Bergelson.

I cannot be totally impartial in my evaluation, since we have subsequently become good friends. I do know that she succeeded as a teacher at the Flatbush Yeshiva, involving the students with works not only by Bialik and Agnon, but also by the contemporary poet Natan Zach -- no mean feat in a class of 15 year-olds! I would therefore urge you to keep her application on file and to consider her whenever a job becomes available.
