Dear Dr. Roskies:


I was pleased to have had the opportunity to meet you in Jerusalem in January, and I am delighted to be able to invite you to join the Faculty of The Jewish Theological Seminary of America as Assistant Professor of Jewish Literature for a three-year period beginning September 1, 1975. Your salary will be at the rate of ~~\$15,000.~~ ^{\$15,000.-} per annum. In addition, the Seminary will reimburse you for your relocation expenses up to ~~\$5,000.~~ ^{\$5,000.}

You will be expected to teach three courses per semester (nine hours per week) in the Teachers Institute and the School of Judaica of our Seminary. Like all members of the Faculty, you will be expected to advise students, serve on committees, and attend Faculty meetings. Your specific teaching assignments will be worked out by the appropriate deans and the head of your department. In our conversation, we agreed that, for the foreseeable future, you would make at least two-thirds of your offerings in the field of Hebrew Literature. The Seminary would do everything in its power to help you cultivate the field of Yiddish literature as well.

I believe you will want to be in touch with Mrs. Sylvia Ettenberg, the Associate Dean of the Teachers Institute, regarding any arrangements that have to be made for coming to the United States, and with Rabbi David Kogen, Vice-Chancellor of the Seminary, about your obligations and privileges as a member of our Faculty.

We are delighted by your interest in joining the Seminary. Please convey my warmest regards to you and your wife.
