Curriculum: The Search for the Sacred in Judaism and Poetry

Session 1. Barry Holtz--Introduction

Barry will teach a biblical text and lead a general discussion on the theme of the Sacred.

David Rosenberg, Editor of the Jewish Publication Society will initiate the poets' response to the scholars with a commentary on Barry's presentation entitled "The Poet's Ear."

- Session 2. Susan Handelman--Words as Sacred: The Talmudic tradition.
- Session 3. Zalman Schachter--Sacred Worship: The <u>Siddur</u> (Jewish Prayer-book) and its mystical interpretations.
- Session 4. Max Ticktin--The Many Faces of Holiness: Hebrew Poetry--Medieval and Modern.
- Session 5. David G. Roskies--After the Holocaust--Jewish thinkers and poets continue the quest for the Sacred.
- Session 6. Susannah Heschel--In a Different Voice--Women's Perspectives on the Sacred.

All sessions should be based upon one or more $\underline{\text{texts}}$ and should take the form of a seminar in which the text is the focal point for discussion.

N.B. Several times during the three days (see schedule) poets and scholars will meet in twos to pursue the issues in more depth. During the tutorial/chaver periods, the poets will be asked to share poems (either by themselves or others) which they have brought with them to the Conference because of their bearing on the theme of the Sacred.
