LIT 5202Y: THE FICTION OF S. Y. AGNON Wednesday, 10:20-12:10/U 508

The goal of the course is to introduce you to the world of Agnon's fiction, which is a unique space within modern Jewish culture. The course will be generally organized around the development of the Agnon persona, both in terms of the cycle of life as well as the author's geographical movements. The readings will offer a taste of the different genres within the Agnon corpus.

The stories will be read in Hebrew, although students are free to consult translation as they wish. Most all of the texts can be found in English in Mintz and Hoffman, *A Book That Was Lost and Other Stories by S. Y. Agnon*, which you are required to purchase for the course. The class will be conducted in Hebrew, and we will do our collective best to be patient with the different levels of Hebrew knowledge represented by the members of the class. Papers can be written in English. There will be two five-page interpretive essays, in addition to a longer paper at the end of the course.

That longer paper will be devoted to one of three of Agnon's major novels: אורח נטה ללון, הכנסת כלה and תמול שלשום. These novels are not short, and students are advised to make their choice early in the semester so that there is enough time to read the book.
